We had so much going on these past couple months and especially around Christmas time with guest preaching, the local missions celebrations, our Christmas at Jesus Vive, and then leaving exhausted for 2 more weeks of intense missions in the SW. Along with these ministry events we hosted our



friends Francisco, Natalie and Joey, a youth group, a pastor and his family, and another family of worship leaders at different times throughout the holidays, along with our own family stuff off course. When we returned to Los Canelos, we arrived to hosting a group of 38 men, pastors and leaders of churches throughout the region. I was sick, exhausted, it was really not time for a meet and greet in my view. The pastors insisted and came up to the house to meet Minnie and me. The pastors all expressed their heartfelt thanks for the now 3rd consecutive year using of our ministry facility for a time of prayer, fasting, and refreshing as they get ready for another year of ministry. And then they gathered around Minnie and me and prayed for us and thanked God for our ministry. It was a beautiful prayer time together. I guess it was a good time for a meet and greet.

There is just so much to report here this month, so I want to conclude with this story pictured left. This is the start of the greatest act of faith that I have seen in my now 16+ years of ministry. Pastor Maurilio's vision for the church and community

center in Huixtepec, Guerrero (SW Mexico) is well underway and we have already committed to return in 3 months for the grand opening and the wedding of his daughter. We have also committed to give pastor's conferences and another teen camp next January. Pastor Maurilio leads an alliance of pastors in the region. He showed me his vision 2 years ago when there was nothing there but mountain.

Pastor Maurilio and his family live in little more than a big shack with an outside shower and bathroom. The region is poor and he is poor. But he is rich in faith and I'd like to see us come beside this great vision with some consistent help and encouragement in every way for years to come. When they poured the roof, they did so by hand starting at 3am. Over 100 men from the community showed up

to help. Many do not know the Lord. We have seen these kinds of community efforts. I think that many people want to be part of something bigger than themselves and recognize it when they see it. Now, we just have to introduce them the someOne bigger. Below the cross it says Christian Center. Below that it says Christ Saves.

In addressing one of his congregations, Maurilio stated that many people follow the blessings. But some, he noted, the blessings follow. Which do you want to be in 2018?
