Sacrifice is like that isn't it? Many times, it takes more than what we thought. The whole extra mile and then some more after that. We adjusted for a return trip the following week. The family and church community were reeling from the passing of their pastor 3 months prior. I say "were reeling" because they are now reengaged! They're moving forward again. Pastor Tino left them quite a challenge with his dying wish and some large shoes that cannot be filled by just one person. He built the little church building with his own money in his "spare" time while running a tortilla business and pastoring his main church for some 40 years along with his beloved wife.... It was a labor of love for his family and that part of the Aramberri community.

The family thanked us in so many ways throughout the weeks in Aramberri. I mentioned to Tino's son Esau that I would like to see a particular path up a nearby mountain overlooking the city. Esau recounted a story of when Jesus beat up the soldier! Every year there is a reenactment of Good Friday by some in the community. One year, the soldier got a little too realistic with his whipping of Jesus while he was carrying the cross up that mountain. "Jesus" dropped the cross and got into a fight with the soldier! I think we can all relate to that "Jesus". Esau took my brother-in-law Juan and I up there early one morning. I took the photos above on top. Happy to report there was no fighting!

The brethren in Aramberri have also asked us to help them during this transition as they wait for God to call their next pastor. We will be able to help. There are so many praise reports to write, but I thank God for this new connection and for what only He can do in such an
